

#22 Zach Koerner. Zach is accompanied by his parents Terry and Trina Koerner. Zach is originally from Lapeer, MI and has played for Concordia for 4 years. Zach is majoring in Biology and minoring in Business here at Concordia. After Zach graduates he has an internship lined up in Mossel Bay, South Africa for marine science/ecotourism.

Zach scored a career high 6 points against University of Michigan Dearborn this season and was perfect from both the line and the floor.

Zach currently has never missed a free throw as a Cardinal (8 for 8).

Head Coach Ben Limback had this to say about Zach, "From a dislocated shoulder, to a jellyfish sting, to a post-game screaming session, Zach is one of the toughest guys I have ever coached. He has also coined many inspirational phrases during his time here including: "don't be complacent", "represent the 8-1-0", "anyone see the Notre Dame score?", and "what do you mean which one is Big Zach and which one is Baby Zach?". Besides the physical play and bulldog mentality he brings, Zach's spirit, humor and intensity will surely be missed."

#12 Chad McMullen. Chad is originally from Pinckney, MI. He is the son of Andy and Denise Stephens and Joel and Lisa McMullen. Chad is a Business Administration major here at Concordia. Chad played 4 years for the Cardinals and has been a crucial part of their success. As a sophomore Chad scored a career high 24 points on Dec. 5th 2009 against Mt. Vernon Nazarene. Chad dished out a career high 7 assists his freshman year against Conference rival Madonna University back on Valentine's Day of 2009.

In Chad's career he has scored 622 points and grabbed 182 rebounds. Chad has also dish out 127 assists and nabbed 54 steals in his career.

Chad has not only been exceptional on the court but also in the classroom. He was named to the WHAC All-Academic Team and was named a NAIA All-American Scholar Athlete as a junior and will earn both awards again as a senior.

Coach Limback had this to say about Chad, "Chad has a tremendous work ethic that he shows in all areas of his life. Whether he's cutting grass, managing the nest, studying for an exam or working on his mid-range game, Chad strives to do his best. No doubt he will continue to be successful in life."

#50 Jeremy Simmons. Jeremy is son of Tyrone and Ruth Simmons. Jeremy has two siblings, Leniqua and Terrance. He hails from Detroit, Michigan where he attended Lutheran Northwest high school. Jeremy has played four season for the Cardinals. Jeremy has scored 620 points in his career. He has grabbed 612 rebounds in 4 years which is good for 4th all-time in a career. Jeremy has also blocked 169 shots which makes him #1 all-time for blocks in a career here at Concordia.

Jeremy's freshman year he blocked 58 shots which is good for 2nd all-time in the Cardinals' record books for a single season. Those 58 blocks were ranked him 10th in NAIA DII in total blocks and 12th in Blocks per game (1.87).

Jeremy scored a career high 18 points against University of Michigan Dearborn back on Jan 24th 2009. That same year Jeremy swatted a career high 6 shots against Holy Cross College and grabbed a career high 13 rebounds against Concordia University Chicago in the 58th annual CIT.

Coach Limback had this to say about Jeremy, "Jeremy has made an impact on this program for 5 years. Even during his red-shirt year, I knew he was going to be special force on defense. A friend to all, Jeremy is one of the best teammates I have had the pleasure coaching."

#10 Austin Cook. Austin is accompanied by his parents Rick and Sharron Cook. Austin is originally from Mt. Clemens, MI. Austin will graduate with a degree in Business Administration with a concentration in Accounting.

Austin has played 4 seasons for the Cardinals and has played in 103 games. In Austin's career he has scored 684 points, grabbed 193 rebounds, dished out 155 assists and nabbed 49 steals. Austin is currently shooting 82.4% from the free throw line this season which is good for 6th all-time for a single season. Austin shot 42.8% from behind the arc his junior season which is good for 6th all-time for a single season. That same season Austin was ranked 3rd in NAIA DII in Assists/Turnover Ratio (2.9). Austin scored a career high 21 points his Junior season on Jan 15th 2011 against the National Champions Cornerstone University. Austin has not only been exceptional on the court but also in the classroom. He was named to the WHAC All-Academic Team and was named a NAIA All-American Scholar Athlete as a junior and will earn both awards again as a senior.

Coach Limback had this to say about Austin, "Austin is more than just one of the best shooters to come thru Concordia. The high standards and morals Austin carries off the court has made an enormous impact on this program. His competitiveness and pursuit for perfection will take him far in the business world."

#33 Rocko Holmes. Rocko is accompanied by his parents Arnold and Bonnie Holmes. Rocko hails from Cadillac, MI and has played 4 seasons for the Cardinals. He is studying Business Administration with a concentration in management here at Concordia. After college he plans on doing a mission trip.

In his career Rocko has scored 1322 points which is good for 9th all-time in the Cardinal record books. Rocko has also grabbed 654 rebounds which is good for 3rd all-time. And he has blocked 44 shots which is good for 8th all-time. Rocko has also recorded an astonishing 15 double doubles in his career.

Rocko is currently averaging 18.6 points and 8.1 rebounds per game this season. He has a 54.9% field goal percentage for the season which is good for 4th all-time. He also has currently grabbed

172 defensive rebounds this season which is good for 5th all-time. As a junior, Rocko was named to All-Conference 2nd Team. He was named the WHAC player of the Week on Jan. 18th 2011.

Scored a career high 30pts this season against Trine University back on Nov. 22nd 2011. Rocko's second best scoring performance of his career came on the National level as he scored 29 points against the University of Michigan last season on Dec. 6th 2010. He grabbed a career high 15 rebounds on Jan 7th 2012 against Northwestern Ohio.

Coach Limback had this to say about Rocko, "Rocko's development from his freshman to his senior year has been nothing short of amazing. His soft hands, quick release, and tremendous footwork have made him one of the most dominant post players concordia has ever seen."
